Bill Fischer attended the January 13, 2009 Corryville Community Council (CCC) meeting to explain the City's proposed use of Corryville District TIF revenue to fund the streetscape planning for the 2901 Highland development, and developments along Short Vine. The CCC distributed the information, encouraged community discussion, and advised that a vote to approve the funding would occur at the February 10, 2009 meeting.

At last night's meeting a motion stating "the CCC approves \$100,000 in Corryville District TIF revenue to fund the City's streetscape planning for the 2901 Highland development and developments from the 2600 through 3000 blocks of Short Vine" passed unanimously, with 11 in favor and 0 opposed.

We continue to appreciate the City's active involvement in Corryville's revitalization efforts.
