

## **CORRYVILLE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES**

### **June 12th, 2007**

Meeting called to order at 6:04 pm.

#### ***Approval of Minutes:***

The May minutes were approved as written.

Dan Schimberg reminded everyone that he was resigning as CCC President after this meeting. He thanked the UVA and CCC for the generous Corryville gift certificate he received at the UVA meeting earlier in the day.

#### ***Police & Safety Report:***

UC Officer Dave Henson reported most crime stats were down for the month. He explained the dorm shooting was the spill over from a robbery which occurred earlier at a campus event. They have surveillance photos, but a non-cooperative witness. Anyone with information is asked to call Crime Stoppers at 556-1111.

Neighborhood CPD Officer Wiley Ross introduced Captain Eliot Issac who is the new head of District 4. Officer Ross presented the crime stats which continue to show a decline. He reported the UVA is in the process of taking bids for the new camera surveillance system. The system is hooked up to UC's system, and though not monitored, is recorded in the event there are issues. He was asked about the status of the loitering situations at the corner of Oak and Bellevue, and Bellevue and Rochelle, and responded they've been quieted and are being watched.

#### ***Treasurers & Neighborhood Support Program (NSP) Report:***

Dan Plofchan was not able to attend the meeting but reported the books are balanced.

#### ***Short Vine Community Urban Re-Dev Corp (VCURC) & University Village Business Association (UVA) Report:***

Scott Enns said progress continues on the projects previously reported at the April and May CCC meetings. He expressed disappointment that none of the six 'clean & safe' grant applications made to the Uptown Consortium received funding. He reported they have identified several owner-occupied properties for the 'World Changers' re-hab project, but are still looking for more.

Scott thanked Dan Schimberg for his dedicated service to the community.

#### ***Corryville Community Dev Corp (CCDC) Report:***

Clyde Nowlin concurred with Scott Enns, and also had high praise for Dan Schimberg's lengthy and dedicated service.

Clyde announced that Great Traditions, developer for The Village at Stetson Square, received numerous Home Builder's of America awards, including "Best Planned Community of the Year".

Clyde introduced Bob Niedecker, with Buckingham, the company who manages Stetson Square. An attendee questioned when the retail space at MLK and Highland was scheduled to open. Vicki Flynn, Stetson Square Condo Sales Manager, responded in October.

***Corryville Recreation Center (CRC) Report:***

Director, Margaret Ahlrichs, announced her retirement is 'on hold' temporarily. She reported:

- The Rec Center has hired 1 & ½ teens for the NSP community clean-up project.
- City pools are open.
- The Rec Center's pre-registered day camp has begun with about 100 youth.
- Several instructional sports programs like the Reds Rookie League and Junior Tennis League will begin soon.

***Old Business:***

Kay Weaks reported that the Corryville Scholarship donor, Jeff Jacobs, gave the Scholarship Committee permission to explore alternative criteria for scholarships to benefit Corryville youth. No scholarships are currently being funded. The account balance is \$8,766.66. Jeff will make the next donation this September, and the final \$5,000 donation some time next year.

***Announcements:***

Vashon Christian, with Comey & Shepard Realtors, invited participation in the 'Uptown Corryville Community Wide Open House', being held June 24th from 1to 4pm, followed by a reception at Stetson Square. Registration is necessary.

Danielle Williams announced the former 'Serenity' lounge, at Short Vine and Charleton, is under new management, and will be called 'Desire'. She invited the community to make reservations for a 'Meet & Greet' event on June 22nd from 5-7pm.

Meeting adjourned at 6:41pm.
